The *Polish Cultural Memory Today* course features an exploration of Polish culture in and around the port city of Gdansk, Poland.

Over a two-week period, students will participate in on-site lectures and site excursions reflecting Polish culture, history, literature, and contemporary issues. Experience a 1000-year history of trade, commerce, architecture, famous battles and folk traditions; check out the longest boardwalk in Europe, unspoiled sandy beaches and the vibrant nightlife of Sopot; wander through the battlements and palace of the Teutonic Knights at Malbork; visit the Mennonite Settlement in Zulawy; walk in the footsteps of modern-day freedom fighters in the European Center of Solidarity.

In addition, this travel/study course offers a variety of cultural and social activities in the beautiful Baltic coastal area of the Tri-city: Gdansk, Sopot and Gdynia.

Participants are responsible for travel to and from Gdansk, Poland. They should plan to arrive in the afternoon of June 4, 2017 and must be present until the morning of June 17, 2017.

All participants applying for the travel-study must have the approval of the instructor.



Travel Fee: \$700 CAD (subject to change) includes accommodation, in-country transportation, and entrance fees. Airfare to Poland, meals, health and trip cancellation insurance, as well as University of Manitoba tuition are **not** included. Please inquire for more details.

Payment of \$250.00 CAD (includes \$200.00 non-refundable deposit) to reserve your spot is being accepted starting February 24, 2017. Spots will be reserved on a first come first serve basis.

A second payment of \$450 will be due March 31st.

All fees are paid to the University of Manitoba by Cheque, Visa, MasterCard or cash.

Canadian residents are advised that a passport is required. Non-Canadians should contact Foreign Affairs for information on obtaining travel documents, phone 1-800-567-6868.
