FRYDERYK CHOPIN IN MANITOBA!


The Polish Consulate General in Vancouver invited Frediric Chopin i.e. his bronze head.

AN INTERVIEW WITH JOLANTA GRONOWSKA FOR I.PL

There are still over two years to the anniversary, and the Polish community in Manitoba has already decided to start preparations for the celebration of the millennium of the coronation of Bolesław the Brave as the king of Poland. Why?

The first king of Poland. This is key. Boleslaus the Brave was the first, and Poland from a duchy became a kingdom. (not sure what the content is here?) Using today's language, we would say the upgrade of our country could only happen once. We realize that this is a special anniversary and we are lucky to be living at this time.



Some people still remember the celebration of the great jubilee of the thousandth anniversary of the adoption of Christianity in Poland.

Yes, it was - we can say - quite recently, but then, on the other hand, more than half a century ago. It's just, that anniversaries like these two, which completely changed the course of our country's history, elevated Poland to a different level in the family of European nations, we have two and in close succession. We will have to wait over 300 years for the next significant millennium anniversaries. We will not live to see it, nor will our great-grandchildren. This is the distance of many generations. Therefore, being aware of how important a moment in national continuity we will have to celebrate, we want to prepare for it very well.

And that's why you've formed a special team...

This is the committee for the celebration of the thousandth anniversary of the coronation of Bolesław the Brave as king of Poland. This team will grow as ideas for the scale and intensity of these celebrations crystallize. Just like Gniezno, which I know has been preparing for two years, being aware that it will be a great opportunity to promote the city, we realize that such an anniversary is a chance for us to promote Poland in Canada. In a multicultural society, it is more difficult to reach awareness with a historical message, but this anniversary, in my opinion, gives such an opportunity.

What are you going to do to celebrate the anniversary and show Canadian society that Poland already has a thousand years of statehood?

It must be remembered that Canada, quite recently, five years ago, celebrated its 150th anniversary. The state was proclaimed on July 1, 1867. This message about the thousand-year history of Poland must be strong and "with a long lead". There will certainly be a campaign in social media, which we will reach a wide community, during this year's celebrations, there will be events of Polish community organizations thematically related to the celebration of the millennium. We will also want something permanent to remain after these celebrations, some visible sign on the Canadian prairie, here in Manitoba, where Poles make a huge contribution to building Canada. But I also do not hide that we do it for ourselves, to be able to enjoy that we are Poles, that despite such a distance, we feel a deep bond with our homeland and we are proud of it.

Gniezno first in the World. Perhaps Winnipeg is second?

There's nothing to wait for. A second chance for such a celebration in a thousand years. Who of us will live to see it?



Dear Polonia,

The new year started very dynamically. A lot of changes within Polonia. As part of the congress, I appointed two

committees: for preparations for the celebration of the millennium of the coronation of the first king of Poland (2025) and for organizing the general convention of the Canadian Polish Congress (2024). The significance these events for us, do not need to be explained. They will be the leitmotiv for the near future.

We have completely changed our immigration policy. We have come out with our offer as part of the MPNP program. I gave an interview to the i.pl portal, which is part of the largest media group in Poland. As a result, this interview will be published in over 20 regional newspaper portals in Poland. As part of this material, a message to Poles by Minister Jon Reyes was also published. As part of the new approach to immigration, we immediately engage newcomers in the activities of the Polish community.

The Polish community in Manitoba has great potential and even greater opportunities. I am responsible for its development, not its duration, so there will be more changes.
