Celebrations of the Sixtieth Anniversary of PCWF, Branch 7 in Winnipeg

Polish Canadian Women's Federation, Branch 7 in Winnipeg is recognized as one of the most active Polish organizations in Manitoba. This year, on October 14, the Branch celebrated its sixtieth anniversary. The jubilee year activities culminated with a splendid Gala event attended by numerous representatives of Polish artistic, religious, and charitable organizations, as well as many distinguished members of Polonia in our province. Consul General of the Republic of Poland, Mrs. Magdalena Pszczółkowska, sent her official congratulations, which were delivered by vice- Consul, present during the event, Mr. Pszczółkowski. Mrs. Katarzyna Grandwilewska, national president of the Polish Canadian Women's Federation, Mrs. Aleksandra Kosińska, vice- president of the Federation for Western Canada, and Mrs. Jolanta Gronowska, president of Polish Canadian Congress in Manitoba, were present among the honored guests of the Biesiada.

Branch 7 president, Mrs. Maria Szymańska, took the helm of the anniversary activities. Mrs. Zofia de Witt served as Master of Ceremonies, and vice-president Ms. Wioletta Los took charge of the artistic aspects of the events. Father Tomasz Kościński OMI offered the blessing for the meal and for the well-being of all gathered. Guests enjoyed delicious specialties of traditional Polish cuisine in the beautifully decorated banquet hall of Holy Ghost Church. Musical entertainment included performances by Kapela Czerwona Rzeka, who welcomed arriving patrons, accordion accompaniment by Mr. Henryk Kuzia, and lively dance sets by D.J. Kolt. Guest also had a chance to see an exhibition of our activities and achievements over the last 60 years. The scrumptious appetizers and dinner courses were expertly prepared by the parish chapter of the Knights of Columbus and Mr. Jan Leszczynski of M& S Meat Market.

The main attraction of the artistic program was a performance of "Boryna's Wedding", presented by the SPK "Iskry" Dance Ensemble. The work, based on Chłopi (The Peasants), a novel by Polish Nobel laureate W. Reymont, celebrated the nation's music and folklore. Beautiful dances and songs were justly rewarded with enthusiastic applause.

During the evening, distinguished members of Branch 7 were awarded gold, silver, and bronze medals of the Federation as well as certificates of appreciation for their service. An example of such a service was a donation drive for Harvest Manitoba food bank, which took place during the Gala. We were able to collect 205 lbs. of non-perishable food items worth approximately \$658.


ELECTIONS TO THE POLISH PARLIAMENT IN WINNIPEG
